

CITY OF GLOBE
Public Hearing Regarding Use of CDBG Funds

The City of Globe is expected to receive approximately \$417,726 in FY2018 federal CDBG funds from the Arizona Department of Housing Regional Account (RA). The City of Globe has not applied for the State special projects (SSP) account. CDBG funds must be used to benefit low-income persons and areas, alleviate slum and blight or address urgent need. Based on citizen input as well as local and state planning objectives several potential projects have been selected to be forwarded to the State of Arizona with a request for funding. A public hearing will be held at the regular City Council Regular meeting at 6:00 pm on May 8, 2018, at the Globe City Council Chambers; 150 N. Pine Street, Globe, Arizona 85501 to discuss the potential projects. It is expected that the City of Globe will select the final projects at this hearing and adopt applicable resolutions. The potential CDBG projects are named and described as follows:

1. Varies Globe City Streets for 2" mill and fill – Asphalt project. Streets to include parts of High, Oak, South, Russel, Cedar and 3rd Streets for "asphalt mill and fill work". Project costs estimated approximately \$596,629.80. This activity will meet the Low to Moderate Income Objective and will benefit approximately 7376 residents of whom 4573 (62%) are low to moderate income.
2. Renovation and Repairs to the Michelson Building located at 157 S. Broad Street, Globe, Arizona to Include, but not limited to, roof repairs, elevator installation and general renovations. Project costs estimated at approximately \$430,000. This activity will meet the Low to Moderate Income Objective and will benefit approximately 7376 residents of whom 4573 (62%) are low to moderate income.
