## Dast Round Mountain Trail

East Round Mountain Trail starts at the visitor center (point $\mathbf{A}$ ) and traverses uphill to the top of Round mountain an elevation gain of 380 feet to point $\mathbf{D}$. on the Boulder Trail. After 0.23 mi you will reach the junction with the Ridge Trail (point $\mathbf{O}$ ). Another 0.25 mi you meet Box Canyon trail again (point $\mathbf{K}$ ), continuing for another 0.27 mi to the Ridge Trail (point J), 0.06 miles to Ridge Trail (point G) and finally 0.19 miles

## Box Canyon Trail

 (point K), after 0.03 miles Juniper Tree Rest Area (point $\mathbf{L}$ ) is off to the left. Continuing south another 0.52 miles to the junction of the Ridge Trail (point $\mathbf{M}$ ). Hiking 0.28 miles will bring you back to the junction of East Trail (point $\mathbf{F}$ ). Trail (point M).

## Boulder Canyon Trail

Take East Round Mtn Trail for 0.19 miles to point $\mathbf{F}$, veer to the right, the Boulder Canyon Trail extends 0.72 miles to the jct of Box Canyon Trail (point N). Stay left to remain

Bidge Trail
This trail was added to the system in 2010. The trail starts at junction of Boulder Canyon Trail (point G), and loops to the northeast with an optional side loop points $\mathbf{H} \& \mathbf{I}$, then heads southwest to the junction of Boulder Canyon Trail (point J), traverses another 0.23 miles to Boulder Canyon Trail (point $\mathbf{O}$ ), continues south 0.41 miles to Box Canyon

A premier Arizona hiking destination nestled in a pristine desert setting with moderate climate and spectacular views provide ideal hiking conditions. Round Mountain Park is located at the end of South Street from Highway 60. Round Mountain is home to 6 different hiking trails. From beginner to expert, there is something for everyone, from a leisurely walk or jog, to long distance and rocky terrain that will challenge
 even the most accomplished hikers. Dedicated on May 13, 1997, the 386 acre park offers over 6.7 miles of hiking trails with scenic vistas, ramadas for picnics, benches to rest your feet, and a visitors center with restroom facilities. The park was originally designed by the UA Landscape Architecture program, and has been upgraded by various service organizations, local businesses, and the City of Globe. Today volunteers work tirelessly to maintain the trails.
Be prepared when hiking in the park, weather conditions could change rapidly.

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Bull's Ese Rock Loop Trail
A 0.36 mile side hike veer left at point B. Look for the "Bull's Eye Rock," a
great spot to rest and take a picture.


## Prospector's Trail

Just a short 0.16 mile walk to the picnic ramada.
